We would like to encourage anyone who may be coping with the problems of caring for someone with symptoms of dementia just to "make contact". We are also hoping that anyone who may be a bit concerned that their husband, wife, partner, mum, dad, or friend has become more than "just a bit forgetful", or "moody", or "confused" at times will think about seeking some advice. It can make an enormous difference to their future quality of life if difficulties can be tackled before they become serious.

In June, Julia Dawson of the Alzheimer's Society will be running a course of 4 **information and advice** sessions for family carers – and for those who might find it very difficult to attend, a professional carer can be provided.

Once again, we are so grateful for some very generous contributions to our funds. **The Tea Dance** – A 1940's Dance Spectacular – on 3rd April – was wonderful and made £234 for the project.
